Through our wider opportunities in music instrumental teaching, students will:

- Sing with sensitivity, expression and control particularly of **pitch** and pulse

The Art of Display

- See how some artists choose to display their work on “plinths” and understand how the way work is displayed can affect the way the audience sees the work.
- Use my sketchbook to collect ideas about how other artists consider how their work is displayed.
- Use clay to make quick three-dimensional sketches of figures sitting on “plinths”. I can use the clay to capture the character/emotion of the body.
- Share my work with others and talk about my response to the project, what worked well and what I would like to try again. Listen to the response to my work from my classmates and take on board their feedback.
- Appreciate the work of my classmates, understanding where there are similarities and where there are differences. Share my response to their work.
